
The 18th Annual Gathering was attended by almost 80 PAS members and guests from 17 states and Canada. The East, South and West coasts were represented. While some of our regulars were unable to attend this year, we enjoyed the company of a good number of first timers throughout the long weekend.

Thursday evening we enjoyed a delicious buffet at the Mahan residence near the hotel. A beautiful evening on their deck and yard included 3 varieties of famous Plainwell Ice Cream and a wine assortment including the best of Michigan wineries. After ice cream a sudden downpour chased everyone inside but provided a free carwash for the Pierce-Arrows parked out in Mahan's front yard. The rain was brief but hard enough to flood the streets for a short time. P-A ground clearance proved an advantage over modern cars.





Friday's 103 mile tour on quiet scenic back roads toward Holland, MI on the Lake Michigan coast began with much nicer weather. Our first destination was the VerHage family's private Mopar Museum. The collection features Chryslers from the 1930's through to the 21st century Viper with their primary emphasis being the muscle car era.



Then it was on to the shore of Lake Macatawa to board the Holland Princess sidewheeler for a buffet luncheon and cruise out into Lake Michigan. The food was great and everyone enjoyed the scenery. Our Captain pointed out significant features and homes along the way. Unfortunately the temperature pushed the 90 degree level so many chose the air conditioning on the lower deck rather than the sunny upper deck.

The next stop was at the Nelis Dutch Village where we could step back into the Netherlands of 150 years ago. Traditional displays and demonstrations were entertaining. Some members even took the Dutch Dancing class, but minus the traditional wooden shoes worn by the Village dancers. Two optional ice cream spots were included in the directions back to the hotel. One featured Sherman's, 2nd best to Plainwell Ice Cream.







Our Friday dinner was at the Club Car Grille a short drive from the hotel. Their front façade is an actual railway Club Car, but we had a private room in the back. The food and staff were awesome and we'll keep this as an option in future years. As a bonus, No Ethanol gas was available a short distance back on the return route.








The Saturday tour of 92 miles was mostly on scenic back roads with lake and rivers, but included going through downtown Kalamazoo with road construction and lots of traffic lights. Our first destination was worth that hassle and then some. Dr. Bob LaPenna opened his large eclectic collection of post-war cars located in the former Kalamazoo bus garage and a huge selection of delicious donuts accompanied the coffee. It was more than enough to compensate for those darn stoplights. South of Kalamazoo we were back on the country roads and enjoyed the low traffic scenic route again.





Our next destination was the Langley Covered Bridge. This 282 foot bridge was built in 1887 to cross the St. Joseph River between Centerville and Three Rivers. We first stopped at the 'Farm Park' for a view from the NE, then crossed through the bridge to 'Covered Bridge Park' by the historic 1909 Sturgis Dam where the bridge could be viewed from the SW perspective. After a beautiful drive along the river we enjoyed a great 'happy' buffet luncheon at "Cheers Two".





The banquet Saturday evening at the hotel was preceded by a social hour with wine and snacks. Bill Morris set up a tabletop operational model of the P-A "Galloping Goose". The buffet dinner with carved prime rib and other choices was excellent as usual. This was followed by cake and more Plainwell Ice Cream with many enjoying the opportunity for socializing with old and new P-A friends.





