### On the Road to Glens Falls

We've been asked to provide an account of our preparation and journey to this year's Annual Meet at Glens Falls, NY. We'll start with the preparation.

It is most important to remember that you'll be travelling alone and will need to carry parts to be able to make simple repairs.

#### Parts and Tools to carry with you

• Ignition: Rotor, contact point sets, condensers, distributor cap, ignition coil, complete distributor, five feet of 12 gauge wire, five feet of spark plug wire, set of spark plugs.

• Electrical: Generator brushes, starter brushes, generator cutout, headlight and taillight bulbs

• Fuel related: Electric fuel pump, mechanical fuel pump, complete carburetor, five feet of rubber fuel line, several small lengths of copper tubing and at least 6 fuel hose clamps, fuel filter.

• Mechanical: Inner and outer wheel bearing sets, cooling fan bearing, two gallons of water, can of rust inhibitor, can of "Stop Leak", four quarts of oil, one quart of shock absorber oil, one quart of 85/140 differential oil, water pump grease, Marvel Mystery Oil, 50w oil for the cooling fan hub, sheet of gasket material and a tube of RTV sealer, wheel bearing grease, assortment of clevis pins, cotter pins.

• Tools: The normal assortment of standard tools plus; grease gun, rear hub puller and hub shims, compression checker, tubing cutter, distributor point synchronizer, battery charger, half a broomstick for listening to the engine, flashlight, spark illuminator, engine crank. AND OF COURSE, a Pierce-Arrow Society Roster.

With all of this gathered we went for a 150 mile roundtrip drive from Woodridge to Pontiac, IL to expose potential problems with the '31. Things seemed OK until we got home and I heard the starter skip a beat while cranking. That's the first signal of a cylinder that's losing compression. Immediately I ran a compression check and got the following results:


Clearly, #4 had a problem and the head would need to come off to address it. This all happened one week before our drive would begin. I quickly ordered a head gasket from Sandy's Gaskets and called Great Lakes Region member Greg Long to see if I could borrow his

Ne-Way valve seat cutters. Greg sent them to me via USPS Overnight! Here's what the first four cylinders looked like when I pulled the head.



#4 showed more heating than the others but I figured I should pull all of the valves to redress the seats. The intake valves looked fine so I just lapped them in. The exhaust valves show various amounts of heating so I carefully recut the seats and lapped in the valves. #4 took the most work but you can see the final result before I reassembled it. **TO BE CONTINUED!**
